Genesis:

In the year 1985, few people from different section of the society inspired by the Gandhian philosophy and the noble idea of self-rule founded Lohardaga Gram Swarajya Sansthan as a Trust. The English interpretation of the name Lohardaga Gram Swarajya Sansthan is Lohardaga Village Self-rule Institution. LGSS commits to this philosophy by transferring the ownership of all its efforts to the community who are the ultimate beneficiaries. The founders were also influenced by the philosophy of Vinoba'ji and Jayprakash'ji. They had a deep concern about the contemporary condition of Lohardaga, which had a long history of negligence from all sectors of the society and witnessed abject poverty in spite of having abundance of resources. Later this organization became registered under the Indian Trust Act, 1882 and Foreign Contribution Regulation Act, 1976. With a commitment to bring in socio-economic changes among the most downtrodden people of the area, especially among the women and children of the tribal population and establish a responsive environment for their needs and to improve their quality of life LGSS has walked a long way of twenty-nine years. But people in LGSS are still striving to achieve the ultimate goal of self-rule and are ready to continue the journey.

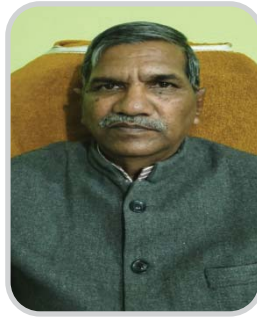

From the desk of the Secretary



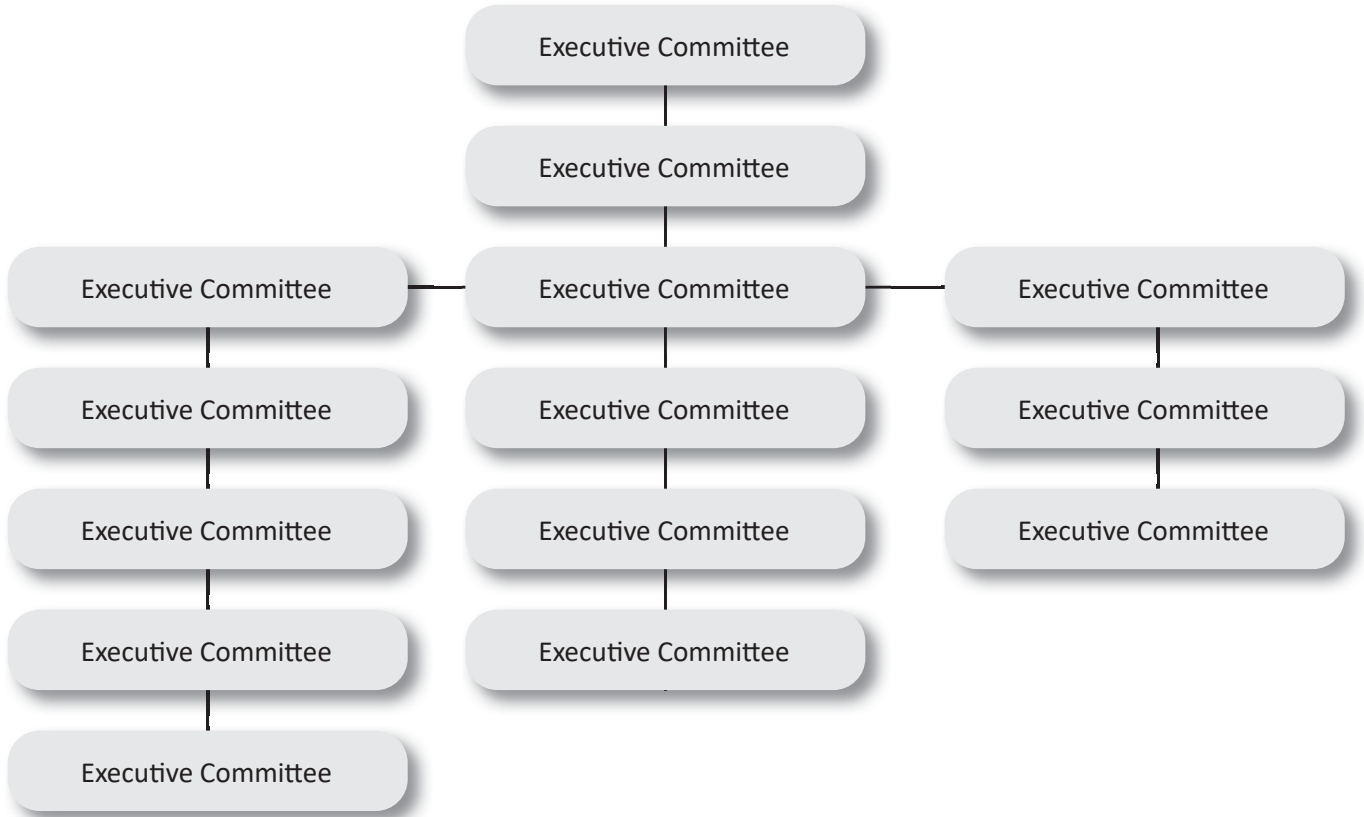

- ❖ To develop appropriate rural technology and promote non-conventional energy sources.
- ❖ To collaborate with the government departments and other development agencies to make convergence of all development programmes in an integrated manner for all-out development.

THEMATIC AREA OF WORK

The three fundamental dimensions (and their interfaces) of rural life, we work for are:

- ❖ **Local Governance:** Strengthening institutions and enhancing self-governing capacity to promote inclusion and access, and participation in collective decision-making.
- ❖ **Enhancing livelihood:** Securing livelihoods that are more dependent on natural resources and highlighting the threshold limits of the given agro-ecological system so as to assist communities in determining consumption levels within the ecological capacity of the area.
- ❖ **Natural Resource Management:** The resources of the community in the form of individual and community are the main resource.

Project wise intervention

(A) Child Rights and Child protection

A.1 CHILDLINE

CHILDLINE is a project sponsored by Government of India under the Ministry of Women and Child Development (MOWCD) providing childcare and Protection. This project was initiated in the year 2018 in Lohardaga district in partnership of CHILDLINE India foundation. CHILDLINE works for the protection of rights of all children aged from 0 to 18 years. Their special focus is on all children in need of care and protection, especially the more Vulnerable sections.

During the financial year CHILDLINE have successfully conducted many rescue operations successfully with the support of police and other aligned system. Rescued children have been sent for long term rehabilitation with the help of Child welfare committee Lohardaga and have intervened different types of cases which have been mentioned below in achievements.

Intervention categories

- Child laborers working in organized as well as unorganized sectors.
- Children engaged in domestic work, especially girl.
- Children affected by physical / sexual / Emotional abuse in family, schools or institutions.
- Children of commercial sex workers.
- Victims of child trafficking, child marriage, Child labor.
- Children abandoned by parents or guardians.
- Missing children
- Run away children.
- Children who are victims of substance abuse.
- Children in conflict with the law.
- Mentally challenged children.
- Children affected by conflict and disaster.
- Children whose families are in crisis.
- Street children and youth living alone on the streets.
- Children who need emotional support and Guidance.

A.2 Acceleration successful reintegration of survivors of trafficking and exploitation through transforming practices of service providers, strengthening resilience of children and young people and fostering community support networks in west Bengal and Jharkhand

Terre des hommes (Tdh) is the leading Swiss organization for children's aid and Lohardaga Gram Sawarajya Sansthan (LGSS) is Tdh partner since 2016.

In Lohardaga, children and young people face violence, migration and poor health services. LGSS support victims of trafficking and exploitation return to safe, protective and resilient communities and empower girls at risk of unsafe migration. Through innovative and sustainable approaches as we understand that poverty pushes families to migrate where often there are no proper facilities for living and unsafe conditions increase the chances of violence and discrimination against girls and young women in a context of patriarchal social values. Many cannot go to school and are instead sent to work. Traffickers work by convincing girls to run away in search of a 'good life in the city'. Many end up in situations of domestic violence or in prostitution.

In 2021-2022, LGSS worked in 5 panchayat of kisko block of Lohardaga district with 125 adolescent directly in Tdh's Kabbadi project to empower and raise migrant girls' confidence to make safer choices, so they can create a future they want to lead, which is void of child marriage, gender-based violence and trafficking.

Besides of Kabbadi for protection for adolescent, LGSS also worked with 860 society member under Tdh project which includes school student, community member, community influencers and male member of society through innovative and sustainable approaches to aware gender-based violence.

As a result 125 children improved their life skills and independence also improved their knowledge on gender issue and unsafe migration.

A.3 Intensive area against CHILD trafficking

Kailash Satyarthi Children's Foundation (KSCF) founded by Nobel Peace Laureate Kailash Satyarthi is a leader in child protection and child development. It envisions a world free of violence against children and works on an array of issues that affect vulnerable children and their families.

Objective of the program:-

Base objective of the program is to ensure that no child fall out of the safety net, if child becomes the victim of trafficking, promote action by operational AHTU Thana. To ensure justice in child friendly manner child protection and police personnel will be sensitized and child friendly police station and court creation will be ensured in 20 high risk.

Intervention

- Lohardaga gram swarajya Sansthan conducted public dialogue on child trafficking and sexual abuse. DC Lohardaga Shri Dilip kumar Toppo was the chief guest of the program. Along with DC Lohardaga many depart-

ment from district administration were present in event. Total number of participants were 309

- LGSS have given notes for advocacy for parliament to Lohardaga MLA in 16 July 2021 for the support of anti human TRAFFICKING bill.
- We conducted survey and identified and send 100 most venerable villages, where 7 children have been connected with sponsorship foster through CWC and DCPO.
- 25 survivors have been identified among which 17 survivors have been given counseling and training.
- We identified 37 traffickers from Lohardaga district.
- Among 37 traffickers 11 have been arrested with the help of police department.
- 16 children have been rescued produced in CWC, have done counseling and have done restoration with the help of district administration
- One Training Cum Meeting has been conducted with Lohardaga Anti Human Traffic Unit (AHTU) Thana on 26 October 2021.
- One special meeting organized in Pesrar Thana because it has been found that among all the 7 blocks of Lohardaga district pesrar block is the most sensitive block for child trafficking.
- 3 meeting organized with Women self help group. 3 meeting with PRI members and 1 meeting with anganwadi workers have been organized.
- 20 volunteer have been recruited for ground level awareness through meeting and door to door awareness.
- LGSS celebrated Constitution day in 38 government and private schools of Lohardaga Jharkhand. 3959 students and teacher took oath on Indian constitution day.

(B) Livelihood

B.1 “Livelihood Enhancement of Poor and Marginalized Farmers of Kairo Block in Lohardaga District of Jharkhand through Climate Change Adaptive Farming And Employment Generation With MGNREGA Convergence Programme”.

With the support of Azim Premji philanthropic initiatives, Lohardaga Gram Swarajya Sansthan is implementing livelihood program in 26 villages of 6 panchayats of Kairo block of Lohardaga district with effect from 15th May 2021. The total 26 villages from six panchayat of kairo block are covering 7190 House Hold. Total population in target area is 37867 the 62.28 % of total population is Scheduled Tribe which is mostly Oraons and Oraons. 64 % of the total populations are of worker category and 17% are agricultural labour. The project will target all ST category people from the villages which are around 60% populations. In total 80% populations are of small and marginal category. So our direct beneficiaries will be around 4500 HH and 30000 populations.

Objectives:

- ❖ Institutional strengthening towards livelihood promotion measures
- ❖ Farm and nonfarm based climate change adaptive livelihood promotion
- ❖ Organic cum non-chemical farming
- ❖ Facilitating MGNREGA to address unemployment and resource conservation measures
- ❖ Using bio fertilizer and bio pesticides in their farming practices.
- ❖ 15-20% increase in income from livestock.
- ❖ Farmers get nutritional intake through vegetables from their own garden.

- ❖ 2000 HH will have 30% additional income
- ❖ Activities:
- ❖ Formation and Strengthening of Village Action Group (VAG). Total 312 VAG meeting conducted this year.
- ❖ Total 312 meeting with existing village level organization were organized in intervention area..
- ❖ Three days Panchayat level community based training on MGNREGA. Total 524 villagers attained this training.
- ❖ Three days Panchayat level community based training on climate change adapted farming and sustainable organic farming. Total 234 farmers attained this training.
- ❖ Demonstration of seed bank in all the 26 villages of intervention area.
- ❖ 6 Parboiling units are installed in 6 Panchayats of intervention area.
- ❖ Input support of seeds and Small Equipment in all the 26 villages of intervention area. Total 650 Households access these equipments and 820 Households got Seed support.
- ❖ 26 Solar based pump set up to 1 HP was given in all the 26 villages of intervention area. Total 600 Households used these solar pumps for irrigation in free of cost.
- ❖ 720 farmers got trained on SRI Method of paddy Cultivation.
- ❖ 336 farmers got training on vegetable cultivation.
- ❖ 315 farmers got training on SWI method of wheat cultivation.
- ❖ 1286 are doing vegetable cultivation using organic manure
- ❖ 251 are doing SWI method of wheat cultivation using organic manure.
- ❖ 694 farmers have developed a nurturing garden to meet the needs of vegetables.
- ❖ 210 compost pits are developed in intervention area.
- ❖ 750 Farmers are manufacturing organic manure for their personal and business use.
- ❖ 22 vermi Compost and 66 urine take pit are developed in intervention area.

B.2 Livelihood Enterprises & Development Program (LEDP)

LEDP programme has the objective to enhance the capacities of Self Help Group members and their family members through identification of the skill gaps its up gradation, demonstration and development of livelihood activities in the project areas supported by NABARD. This programme is operational since 2021 and area of operation is Saktar and Amganv villages of Albert Ekka Jari block of Gumladistrict in Jharkhand. **we have observed following outcomes and achievements of the project:**

- Organized Participatory Rural Appraisal (PRA) to for identification of kind of activities needed in the programme – SHG members were participants in the whole process.
- Selected 90 members in 15 WSHG.
- Completed skill up gradation residential training of 90 SHG member (7 days per training, 30 participants per batch)
- Rope making started by SHG members through solar power machine.
- Two rope making machine unit established in Saktar and Amganv village.
- 11 SHG credit linked with Bank of India Jari branch.
- Marketing linkage has established.

B.3 E-Shakti- Women Self Help Group digitization Project;-

E- shakti project aims is digitization of all SHGs accounts. The need of digitization of records of SHG's has been felt for quite some time due to patchy and delay in maintenance of books of accounts. Transparent and proper maintenance of records of SHG's will facilitate in nurturing and strengthen of SHG's. It will be also helpful for SHG's credit linkage with Banks. This is helping them access wider range of financial services together with increasing the bankers comfort in credit appraisal and linkages by way of integrating SHG members and banks for efficient and hassle free delivery of banking services by using the available technology.

Achievements of the project in current financial year are;

- ❖ Digitization started with 1829 active SHGs.
- ❖ 1200 member have been linkage with bank.
- ❖ Provided refresher training to 60 animators for master data collection for digitization of SHGs.
- ❖ We have generated 157 loan applications for the SHGs.

B.4 Farmers Producer Organization- (FPO)

LGSS associated with formation and facilitation of Farmers Producer Organization supported by NABARD. Under the Organizational strategy to facilitate the promotion of Farmers Producer organization since 2016 onwards we have registered two FPO namely "Basudha Beej Utpadak Producer Company Ltd." In Lohardaga Block other one "Amrapali Kairo Phal sabji Utpadak producer company Ltd." In Kairo Blok of Lohardaga district under company act. In the current financial year following activities were conducted in these FPOs:

- ❖ Meetings of Board of directors conducted in every quarter for both of company.
- ❖ 1017 share holders enrolled for both of company.
- ❖ Total Rs.2, 79,000 share capital collected from the share holders.
- ❖ Agriculture inputs supply started to shareholder farmers like seed and vermin compost.
- ❖ Marketing linkage started for agriculture produce like Paddy, Maize, Maruwa and Vegetable.
- ❖ Procurement center has been opened in Gajni Village of Kairo block.
- ❖ 4 MT. Vermi compost procured from the member farmers and sold it in market.
- ❖ 1.0 M.T. Paddy seed, 350 Kg Vegetable seed, like Tomato, Pea, Ladies finger, Creeper vegetable has been sold.
- ❖ 170 farmer benefited in this cropping season.

(C) Education

C.1 India Literacy Project (ILP)

India Literacy Project (ILP), funded by ILP- USA, was started in the year 2011 and is continuing. The project is being implemented in Kisko block of Lohardaga district. The vision of ILP to be 'A catalyst for 100% literate and educated India', ILP works at the grassroots to innovate and implement meaningful interventions to improve access to schools, enroll out of school children, retain children who are vulnerable to drop out, improve learning and provide pathways to productive careers.

Key activities undertaken in the project during reporting year.

The key activities. (During the COVID-19 when schools and AWC were closed)

- ❖ Village learning center is established in 40 villages with the help of 50 ILP Vidya Saathi where more than 1250 students got benefited.
- ❖ 50 packet dry rashan distribution to needy children and villagers in the intervention area. Sanitizer, Mask, Oximeter, Thermometer, Gloves were given to community health center of kisko block.
- ❖ Two child marriages have stopped with the effort of ILP team members in intervention area with the coordination of CHILDLINE team.
- ❖ Training given to ALMSC (Aaganwadi level monitoring & support committee), SMC (School Management committee) and AWW's on COVID -19 safety norms, Precautions, Essential food habit and about life style to be safe from Covid.
- ❖ Students have been given support to connect online classes provided in schools.
- ❖ Counseling and career guidance training organized in 10 high schools, where 846 students got benefited.
- ❖ ALMSC (Aaganwadi level monitoring and support committee) is reformed in all 72 AWC.
- ❖ ILP Team helped 56 people to issue new rashan card and 28 job card. 126 people have been supported to work in MANREGA via job card.

(D) Health and Nutrition

D.1 “Intensive social Mobilization Intervention to promote COVID appropriate Behavior and Covid vaccine communication in 20 Tribal Blocks of 4 Districts (Simdega, Gumla, Lohardaga, And Garhwa)”

Program has been funded by UNICEF with the objective to mobilize people for vaccination and to promote COVID appropriate behavior by using deferent method.

- 1) LGSS have conducted 204 nukkad natak in targeted blocks of districts.
- 2) 100 events of miking has been done
- 3) Sensitization of 50,000 pregnant women/ caregivers on complete brestfeeding has been done.
- 4) 60,000 hand washing demonstration has been conducted.
- 5) LGSS conducted and attended meetings with line departments such as Block level task force, civil surgeon, asha , aww, gram panchayat, mukhiya etc for planning of increment of vaccination among people.
- 6) SHG's, AWW, PRI members and community people have been oriented on COVID vaccination and Covid appropriate behavior.
- 7) All the effort has resulted to 22% vaccination to 95 % in all the targeted district blocks.

D.2 Covid-19 vaccination drive

Covid-19 vaccination drive programme supported By Azim Premji foundation to maximize the vaccination dose in Gumla district of Bharno, Sesai and Albert Ekka Jaari block and Lohardaga district of Kairo, Lohardaga, and Bhandra block.

Key achievements

- Completed survey of bharno, sesai and albert ekka jaari block and Lohardaga district of Kairo, Lohardaga, and Bhandra block to know the Gap of 1st and 2nd dose and no dose of vaccination and the reason behind it.
- 31 special vaccination camps organized with the coordination of district and block administration By LGSS in hard to reach area and among the people who were opposing vaccination. 2195 people took vaccine in these

vaccination camps

- participation in 4865 number of district and block level vaccination camps where 194600 people were vaccinated with the effort of LGSS team.
- 10 Block level task force meeting conducted/participated for the 100% vaccination.
- All the effort has resulted to 22% vaccination to 95 % in all the targeted district's blocks.

D.3 Combating Covid-19

Combating Covid-19 programme supported By **Azim Premji** foundation to fulfill the basic need (Dry ration kit) of needy people of kairo, bhandra and Lohardaga block of Lohardaga District.

(E)“Goonj” Dignity for work

The Dignity for work” program was initiated in partnership with the goonj, and international origination in the year 2021. Objective of the program is to develop and maintain village based infrastructure assets engaging the poor and disadvantages community. As part of remuneration the workers are provided dry ration kit, with clothes, shoes, mask, tooth brush, tooth paste etc, with dignity.

- 780 dry ration kits with necessary items provided to 780 poor families under the DFW program.
- 3 temporary bori baandh, 3 km Road repairing and 10 drain cleaning work has been done. Under dignity for work programme.
- 100 small farmers were given vegetable seeds and organic manure under livelihood promotion program.
- 25 beneficiaries have been provided goat under livelihood promotion.
- 10 Vermin compost tank were constructed for vermi compost production
- Covid medicine kit have been distributed to Corona possitive patients.

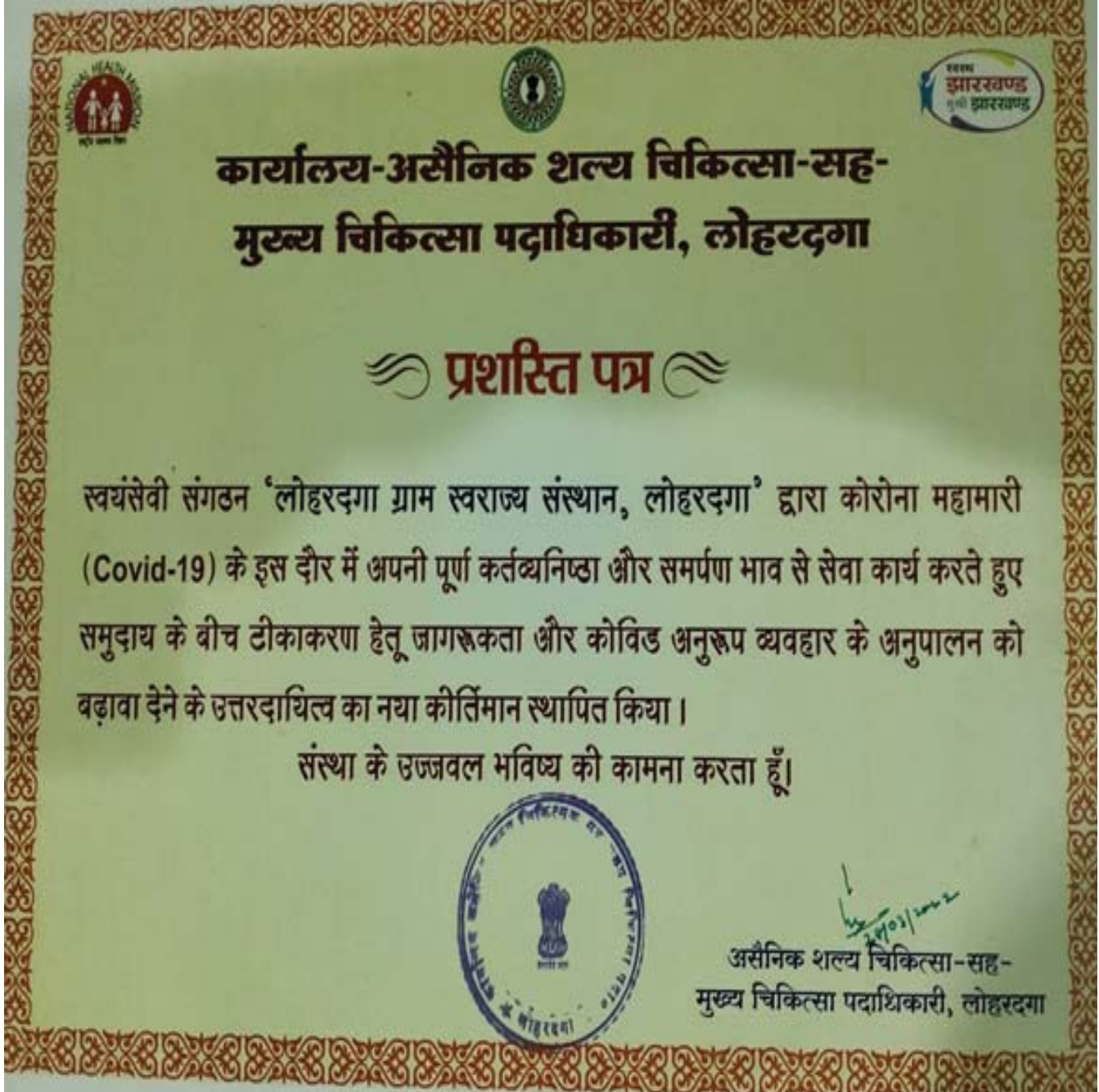

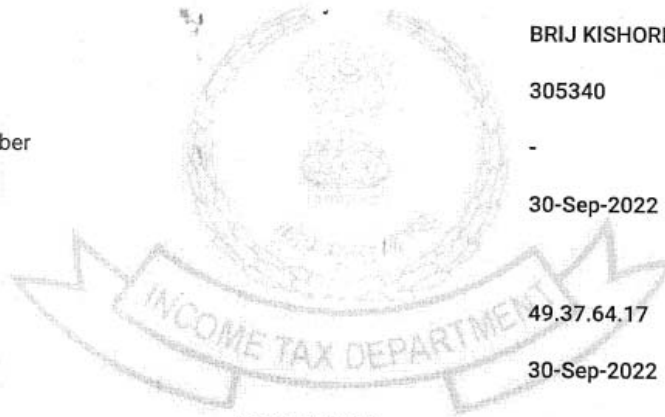
