Project wise intervention

CHILDLINE

CHILDLINE is a project sponsored by Government of India under the Ministry of Women and Child Development (MoWCD) providing child care and protection. This project was initiated in the year 2018 in Lohardaga district in partnership of Childline India foundation.



It's been 3 years of **CHILDLINE** in Lohardaga and have successfully rescued many children from different type of abuses such us sexual harassment domestic violence, child labor, child marriage etc., and have given long term rehabilitation.

When everyone was locked in their home due to covid-19 pandemic, Lohardaga CHILDLINE was busy in imparting duty by giving care and protection to those children who were in need of care and protection.

Victims of child sexual abuse, Child laborers working in organized as well as unorganized sectors, Children engaged in Domestic help, especially girl domestics, Children affected by physical / sexual/ Emotional abuse in family, schools or institutions, Children of commercial sex workers, Victims of child trafficking, Children abandoned by parents or guardians, Children who are victims of substance abuse, Children in conflict with the law, Mentally challenged children, Children affected by conflict and disaster, Children whose families are in crisis, Street children and youth living alone on the streets, Children who need emotional support and guidance.

Case study: - There was a call from 1098 about a girl Child Marriage case. As soon as CHILDLINE Lohardaga got this call, CHILDLINE Coordinator sent two of his team member for the verification of the case, both of them confirmed this within one hour and informed CHILDLINE Coordinator. Coordinator instantly took action and informed this to Kuru B.D.O, Kuruthana, and C.W.C. Coordinator made a Rescue team of CHILDLINE coordinator, two team members and CWC member. This team first went to Kuru B.D.O but he was unavailable that day, but Kuru B.D.O in his absent sent Kuru block C.O as magistrate with the rescue team. CHILDLINE coordinator already informed Kuruthana so took force (police protection) with rescue team and reached where girl was getting married.

Rescue team reached there and found that girl was forcefully being marriage by her parents with a man (age 27). As Coordinator was leading the rescue team he completed all the legal rescue documentation, and asked both the party (girl and boy) to write surrender note including signature of few witness along with the signature of Rescue team. As the man and his family was unaware of the girl age and they had no objection of taking the girl along with the rescue team, so no FIR was lodge against him and his family, But asked them to write a bond letter so they will not repeat this again. Thereafter girl rescued and brought to Kuruthana and S.D registered, after this she had been brought to CHILDLINE Lohardaga, Next day counseling and medical checkup was done by CHILDLINE Lohardaga and presented her in C.W.C Lohardaga. As the girl was from Gumla District, C.W.C gave order to send her to C.W.C Gumla for further intervention. So CHILDLINE Lohardaga took her to C.W.C Gumla. Girl is safe now and is about to complete her class 10th in Gumla.



Transforming reintegration practices of services provider to support survivor of trafficked and exploited children and adolescents.

TDH protects children affected by unsafe migration, promotes safeguarding and protection standards, and builds capacities of child protection professionals. One of major goals is to ensure better child-based skills and knowledge among the government and other service providers working with children. This project is supported by TDH Kolkata and OAK Foundation.

During this reporting year with support of TDH(Terre des hommes) many activities given below:

Awareness Raising and Stigma Reduction: When LGSS started survey in selected 13 villages of Kharki & Parehpat Panchyat of Kisko block we found most of the people in the community earn their livelihood through daily wages. After COVID- 19 lockdown situation got more worst in village level, People had to leave their job; Maximum of them got fired from Job, Many people who came from migration they are struggling to survive in the community. After COVID-19 lots of rumor and stigma ruin the social harmony. School and AWC get closed completely, Children are forced to stay at home and some adolescent we also seen roaming around. Resources of daily earning of family got irregular, Villager had to leave their work and forced to stay in the home, Family dispute has increased, Child abuse cases increased. People have to wear mask now as a ritual, washing hand or use of sanitizer came in daily habit. People are afraid to meet with each other.

- In LGSS initial assessment of finding child in risk, we found 480 children then on priority basic we selected 150 to support directly from TDH support.

- LGSS started to raise awareness through making, hand notes which includes details, Poster, Wall writing, directly contact with community or individual about covid-19 precaution, Symptoms and safety measures.

Risk Mitigation Communication: Through making, hand notes which includes details, Poster, Wall writing, directly contact with community or individual meeting with children and villagers. We informed PRI member also about migrant worker who returned from other state also in making job card and immediate relief fund. We meet government officials and asked their support to make aware about COVID and immediate support to needy villagers.

We make PRI member aware about COVID situation and its prevention possible technique and asked them to aware other villagers and ladies group. We helped villagers to aware about different govt. Scheme and help them to make job card. We made them aware about COVID-19 and importance of hand washing, Wearing mask and cleanliness. In case of any COVID symptom visible among villagers we advised them to go hospital and take COVID test immediately.

After even lockdown of school and AWC, LGSS organizing total level or community level education program by our field staff. Helped student in online classes, awareness campaign of COVID -19 was continuously going on in community to keep them engage so they will be active.

Case Management for Vulnerable Children: The team of 12 people who attended TDH virtual training and all of them are continuously involved in the support of children in all 13 villages. Directly we have covered and focused 150 children in counseling and case management, as well as we have arranged small group meeting or play activities and reached up to 3500 students directly and engaged in several activities and counsel them whenever we felt like needed.

Well-being and Hygiene Kit Distribution: We supported 150 vulnerable children in the month of August and September 2020. The hygiene kit was distributed among them and awareness about sanitation and hygiene was also discussed with them.

Creating livelihood adaption under CLAD Project

To minimize the effect of climate change on livelihood, particularly that of drought a project on creating livelihood adaption under Clad has been initiated in July 2016 with supported by Indo-Global Social Service Society, New Delhi in 15 village (Chetma, Pipra Kalan, Tumagara, Bakoria, Kamaru, Kasiadih, Kulia, Bohita, Jogiyapokhri, Sehra, Dulsulma, Jora, Hudmud, Murma) of Satbarwa Block of Palamu District in Jharkhand. Objective of the project is to :

- Build capacity of the community to adapt livelihood to reduce the effect of climate change.
- Adopt interventions for the reducing hunger situation arises out of drought and continue in future.
- Under the project following activities have been under taken:
- Fruit trees were planted by 500 farmers of the project area
- 481 farmers of the project area started vegetable cultivation and mixed cropping, which added 2-3 thousand rupees increase to their monthly income.
- 107 farmers cultivated paddy by Shree method, which increased their paddy yield from 40% to 50%. Nutrition garden was planted by 809 farmers.
- Rain water harvesting unit has been prepared in the house of 5 beneficiaries of 5 villages, which has improved the water level of that place.
- LBCD loose boulder check dam has been constructed in one village of the project area, through which 27 farmers are cultivating.
- 137 farmers of the project area have started using organic pesticides, which has reduced the cost of farmers along with crop protection.

India Literacy Project (ILP)

The India literacy project, Funded by ILP-USA was started working with LGSS in 2010. After successful implementation of project in Kairo block. We started to work in Kisko block of Lohardaga districts. Under this project 40 villages, 34 schools and 72 AWCs were covered. The project focuses on to empower community for ensuring quality and relevant preschool

education, primary education and empowerment of adolescents as responsible citizen. The main objectives of the projects are:-

- Ensure 100 % pre-school education of 3-5 year children in the Anganwadi center.
- Ensuring quality education for 6 to 14 year child in school with 100 % admission, attendance and retention in the school.

The key activities under taken in the project during 2020-2021:

- TOLA education center is established in 5 villages with the help of 5 ILP Animator where more than 200 students got benefited.
- COVID - 19 awareness and mask distribution in project area.
- 50 packet dry rashan distribution to needy children and villagers in the intervention area.
- Team ILP distributed breakfast in 5 quarantine center at Kisko in May 2020 on request of district administration for 10 days.
- Broom making & FOOT mat making training to 20 adolescents during lockdown.
- Children's day celebrated in 40 villages where painting, games, Yoga, exercise were being done.
- Two child marriage cases have stopped with the effort of ILP team members in ILP intervention area.
- Training given to ALMSC (Anganwadi level monitoring & support committee), SMC (School Management committee) and AWW's on COVID -19 related safety norms, Precautions, Essential food habit and about life style to save from Covid-19.
- Help school and AWC to distribute dry rashan and books during lock down.
- Help students to connect online classes provided by schools.
- Counseling and career guidance training organized in 10 high school level where 846 students got benefited.

E-SHAKTI-Women Self Help Group digitization project

E-Shakti project aims is digitization of all the SHG accounts to bring SHG members under the fold of financial inclusion thereby helping them to access wider range of Financial services together with increasing the bankers comfort in credit appraisal and linkage. This project is operational form 2019 with support of NABARD, Jharkhand. we are implementing phase IV. The project is operating in Bhandra, Senha, Kairo, Lohardaga and Kuru blocks of Lohardaga District.

The achievement of the project in current financial year is:

- 1829 active SHGs were selected in Lohardaga districts in different blocks for digitization.
- 60 animators are worked in this project and every animator is allocated 30 SHG's.
- Provided training to animators for Master data collection for digitization of SHG's.
- Total 60 mobiles given to animators to feed the data monthly basis in every month.

Livelihood Enterprises & Development Program (LEDP)

LEDP programme has the objective to enhance the capacities of Self Help Group members and their family members through identification of the skill gaps its up gradation, demonstration and development of livelihood activities in the project areas. This programme is supported by NABARD, Jharkhand and operational form 2019. Its operational area is Barhi and Sithio villages of Torar panchayat of Senha block of Lohardaga district in Jharkhand. During current financial year (2019-20), we have observed following outcomes and achievements of the project:

- 50 matured SHG members selected from Barahi and Sithio of Senha block for receiving training.
- All selected 150 SHG members received 7 days' Intensive training and 2 days Refresher training for "Mushroom cultivation on Oyster, Button and Milky white mushroom".
- All members are showing interested in taking up livelihood activity of "Different Types of Mushroom cultivation.
- Tie up with Pearl hotel, Novelty hotel of Lohardaga and Central Kitchen of CRPF of Lohardaga and Kekrang for purchasing the mushroom direct to beneficiaries of LEDP.

Aspirational District Programme (NITI AAYOG-SOI), Gumla, Jharkhand with the support of 'SAVE THE CHILDREN'

This project is started 1st July 2020 in 10 AWCs of Sisai block of Gumla district to Improve indicators in Education and health & nutrition with particular focus on Early Childhood Care in the aspirational districts of India with following objectives:-

- Improving nutritional status of children in Intervention Blocks
- Improving and facilitating existing ECCD services in Selected AWCs of intervention blocks
- Technical assistance at District Level for quality roll-out of HBYC initiative

Major Activities done in project :

- Performance Grading of AWCs of 10 AWCs
- Capacity building on IYCF for frontline workers -370 Frontline workers
- Nutrition Child Care Sessions (three days' community based management of SAM and MAM Child): in 10 AWCs

- Capacity Building Workshop of frontline service providers with 50 frontline workers
- Social Behavior Change Communication with coverage of 90 AWCs
- Community Score Card with 10 AWCs
- Interface Meetings with 10 AWCs
- Develop model AWCs for improved service delivery on ECCE & Nutrition in 90 AWCs
- Capacity building of Master Trainers who will train on ECCE and Nutrition-36 LS, 3 CDPOs at district level covered 1670 AWCs of whole block of Gumla.
- Facilitate training of trainers and training of FLWs on HBYC covered 90 AWCs with health workers.

Excluding of project deliverable

- Hygiene kit distributed 2646 HH covering 90 AWCs.
- 201 paddle sanitizer and hygiene kit distributed in Sisai, Ghaghara and Gumla.

BACK TO BASICS: Fostering Continuum in Early and Primary Education of 3 -14 years old Children in Sisai Block of Gumla District - SAVE THE CHILDREN

The aim of this project is 'improving quality and continuity in a child's experiences as they have transitions from early childhood care and education into the primary grade. The project is based on 'NO HARM APPROACH'. In order to avoid negative impacts and maximize positive impacts of the intervention, supporting the already existing audience to sustainability is required. The project envisages improving the continuum of education for children from early and foundational stage. This is done through capacitating of all the relevant stakeholders from 170 AWCs, and 100 schools.

- 8000 school childrens of class 1st and 3rd and 6000 AWCs children aged 3 to 5 year old got benefitted during that period.

Farmers Producer Organization- (FPO)

LGSS is very actively associated with formation and facilitation of Farmers Producer Organization. Under the Organizational strategy to facilitate the promotion of Farmers Producer organization since 2016 onwards we have registered two FPO namely "Basudha Beej Utpadak Producer Company Ltd." Other one "Amrapali Kairo Phal Sabji Utpadak producer company Ltd.". In Kairo Block of Lohardaga district under company act, in the current financial year following activities were conducted in these FPOs:

- Training conducted for Board of directors.
- 1010 share holders enrolled for both of company.
- Total Rs.2, 96,000 share capital collected from the share holders.
- Agriculture inputs supply started to shareholder farmers like seeds and fertilizes
- Marketing linkage initiated for agriculture produce.
- 3.5 MT. Vermi compost procured from the member farmers and sold it in market.
- 1.0 M.T. Paddy seed, 10Kg Vegetable seed, like Tomato, Ladies finger, Creeper vegetable has been sold.
- 156 farmer benefited in this cropping season.



Sustainable Energy Development

In the year 2019 with due communication and coordination LGSS became the partner of SELCO FOUNDATION. The major activity of the project implementation is to support solar light with mobile phone charging for the needy beneficiaries. Total 135 numbers of beneficiaries during this period have been supported and they have achieved a wonder. Total 135 beneficiaries and their family members are happy enough to get the low cost solar lights and fan facilities in an installment basis of chainpur block of Gumla district. The children those who are reading in schools are utilizing their evening in reading and writing by utilizing the lights. The mobile charger in the system is very much beneficial for them and now they are charging the power through the charging system and happy enough for uninterrupted communication. The beneficiaries are happy enough that they will not pay any extra fee for the service. As it is a natural and the power is utilized from the solar source. The guarantee of the service is ensured for 5 years which ensures self-confidence for 5 year.

"Social security and Inclusion promoting the rights of person with disability (PWD)"

The programme on promoting the rights of persons with disability has been undertaken. Since the year 2003 in partnership with CBR Bangalore this programme is aimed at improving the quality of life for person with disabilities and providing them equal opportunities and inclusive environment for fulfilling their duties an responsibility like other people in the society. All the seven blocks of Lohardaga district are covered under this programme.

Under this programme activities as capacity building of PWD's training of DDPO leaders and advocacy has been conducted with these interventions aids and appliances distributed among - 05 PWDs, 105 PWDs linked to disability pension, 82 PWDs provided ration card, 250 PWDs linked to MGNREGA work, 2 PWDs linked to Govt. jobs, 45 PWDs provided PMAY, 1386 plantation by PWDs.

"GOONJ" Dignity for work

The "Dignity for Work" programme was initiated in partnership with the Goonj, an international organization in the year 2020. Objective of the programme is develop and maintain village based infrastructure asset engaging the poor and disadvantages community. As part of remuneration the workers are provided with dry ration kit, with clothes, shoes, mask, tooth brush, tooth paste etc,with dignity.

During this year 670 dry ration kit with necessary items provided to 670 poor families under the dignity for work program. Under this program 15 small pond renovated and 10 roads repairing work has been undertaken.

During the Lock down Vegetable seed and fertilizer provided to 90 farmers to start vegetable cultivation to self consumption and sale purpose.
