From the desk of Secretary

It is with great pride that we present the 37th Annual Report for 2022-23, showcasing our unwavering commitment to the social development sector. Our focus encompasses women empowerment, sustainable agriculture practices, quality education, and healthcare for all, and, most importantly, the protection of child rights and child labour, sexual abuse.



This year, our primary emphasis was on eradicating child labour and safeguarding child rights & POCSO in the Gumla and Lohardaga districts of Jharkhand. We achieved this through community-level awareness programs, the rescue of children, and their subsequent rehabilitation, supported by counseling from the CHILDLINE India Foundation. Our dedicated team handled more than 150 cases of child labour and 128 sexual abuse cases, earning well-deserved appreciation.

Quality education for children remains a top priority for us. In pursuit of this goal, we established 42 Village Learning Centers (VLCs) in 40 intervention villages within the Kisko block of Lohardaga district. Our main objective was to ensure the enrollment of children aged 3-5 years in Anganwadi Centers and those aged 6-14 years in formal schools, thus guaranteeing a high-quality education. We also organized career counseling, distributed teaching and learning materials, formed Bal Sansad (Children's Parliament), and provided life skills training to children.

Our efforts in promoting sustainable agriculture practices bore fruit. We extended support to more than 4500 farmers across 26 villages through organic farming. This program primarily aimed to assist small and marginalized farmers who struggled with food security throughout the year. We empowered these farmers by enhancing their skills, introducing innovative farming techniques, and advocating for organic farming. We are delighted to report that LGSS has established two Farmers' Producer Organizations in Lohardaga as a result of our collective efforts.

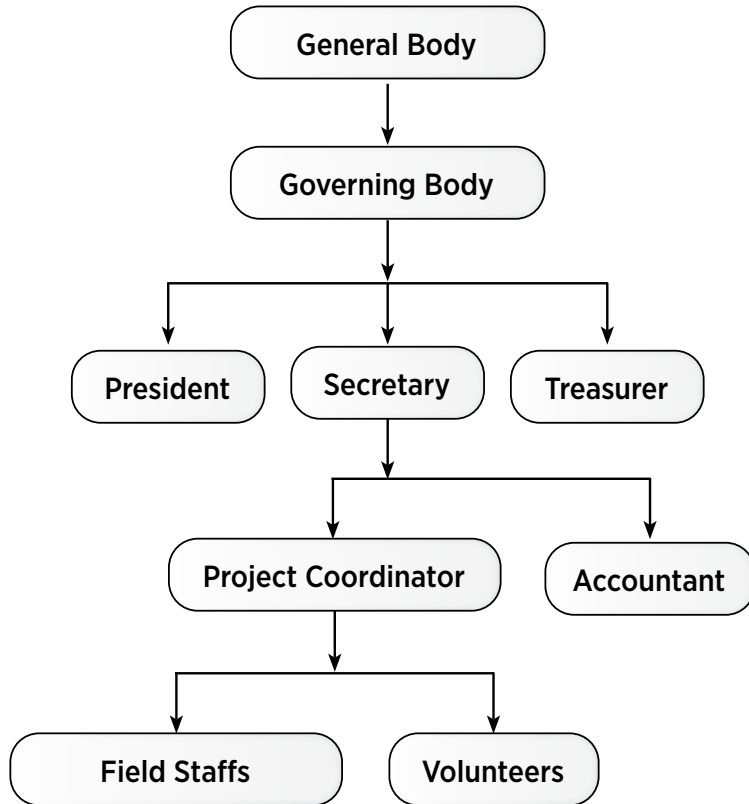

<p>Genesis of organization: In the year 1985, a few individuals from various sections of society, inspired by Gandhian philosophy and the noble idea of self-rule, founded Lohardaga Gram Swarajya Sansthan, registered as a trust in year 1992. The English interpretation of the name “Lohardaga Gram Swarajya Sansthan” is “Lohardaga Village Self-Rule Institution.” LGSS commits to this philosophy by transferring the ownership of all its efforts to the community, who are the ultimate beneficiaries. The founders were also influenced by the philosophies of Vinoba Bhave and Jayaprakash Narayan. They had deep concerns about the contemporary condition of Lohardaga, which had a long history of neglect from all sectors of society and had witnessed abject poverty despite having an abundance of resources. Later, this organization became registered under the Indian Trust Act, 1882, and the Foreign Contribution Regulation Act, 1976.</p> <p>With a commitment to bring about socio-economic changes among the most downtrodden people in the area, especially among the women and children of the tribal population, and to establish a responsive environment for their needs, as well as to improve their quality of life, LGSS has walked a long journey of thirty seven years. However, the people at LGSS are still striving to achieve the ultimate goal of self-rule and are ready to continue their journey.</p>

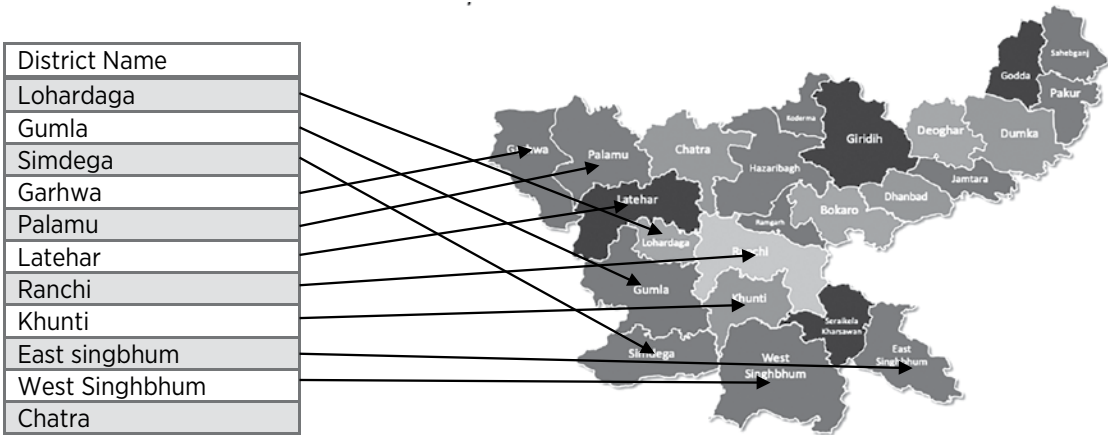
Mission: To empower the rural poor and disadvantaged communities in such a way that they can identify and utilize their potential and resources for their overall development in a sustainable manner.

Child Rights and Child protection

CHILDLINE was a Government of India (GOI) sponsored project under the Ministry of Women and Child Development (MOWCD), providing childcare and the protection of child labour. Lohardaga Gram Swarajya Sansthan (LGSS) is deeply concerned about the protection of child rights and the prevention of child labour. The organization commenced its work with the support of Childline India Foundation in the year 2018. We've been actively involved in tackling issues like child marriage, child trafficking, child abuse, and various other concerns affecting children in our efforts to create a safer and healthier environment for them in Lohardaga. We have raised awareness within the community by organizing meetings, providing training to adolescents, conducting awareness campaigns, intervening in cases, supporting 24*7 for children, lodging FIRs, rescuing children, counselling them, linking them with government programs and benefits, and more. Even during the COVID-19 pandemic when everyone was confined to their homes, Lohardaga CHILDLINE remained operational, providing care and protection to children in need.

In partnership with the **Kailash Satyarthi Children Foundation (KSCF)**, LGSS initiated a project in two districts, namely Lohardaga and Gumla, in Jharkhand. Under this project, LGSS intervened in 35 POCSO (Protection of Children from Sexual Offences) cases in Lohardaga and 93 POCSO cases in Gumla district. The project aimed to deliver swift justice to victims and their families in cases of child sexual abuse.

The project has successfully rescued many children from various forms of abuse, such as sexual harassment, domestic violence, child marriage, and more, providing long-term rehabilitation. Our support person including lawyer and counsellor helped for legal aids and counsel about the better future.

Social Action program

Lohardaga Gram Swarajya Sansthan (LGSS) organized a significant rally on October 16, 2022, against child marriage with the support of the Kailash Satyarthi Children's Foundation. This rally encompassed 131 villages in the Lohardaga district and 74 villages in the Gumla district. What made this event particularly special was that it was led by women leaders. Approx 4000 women and adolescents girls came together in Candle march to protest the Child Marriages.



Women from these villages came together supported to oppose the harmful practices of child marriage. They were determined to ensure that young boys and girls have the opportunity to grow up, receive an education, and build a better future for them. By leading this rally, these women demonstrated their commitment to ending child marriage in their communities.

Success Case Story

A story of 14-year-old girl was living in a small place. Her father was employed in daily wages, and her mother was a housewife. The girl was studying in the 9th grade and had a deep passion for dance and drawing. She excelled in her studies.

A 22 year-old person pretended to love her, manipulated her mind, and convinced the girl to accompany him on a train journey. Both boarded the train at 7 AM from Lohardaga. Some passengers found their behaviour suspicious and promptly dialled the toll-free number 1098 to report the situation. The call was immediately forwarded to Lohardaga CHILDLINE. Upon receiving the message, the CHILDLINE team, in collaboration with the Railway Protection Force (RPF), swiftly proceeded to Lohardaga railway station.

The rescue team halted the train and successfully rescued the girl, although the person managed to escape. The rescue team located the girl and brought her to the RPF for the legal process. After completing all the necessary legal procedures, the girl was handed over to CHILDLINE. She was then brought to the CHILDLINE center and provided with counselling. In the meantime, the CHILDLINE team managed to trace her home and contact her family.

The very next day, her father and other family members came to CHILDLINE Lohardaga. Following all the required documentation and legal procedures, she was presented before the Child Welfare Committee and eventually reunited with her parents. Her father filed an FIR at the police station.

The girl is now happy, continuing her studies, and aspires to become a police officer. The team's quick actions saved the lives of many girls.

Stop Trafficking and Exploitation

Since 2016, LGSS has been engaged in advocacy and evidence-building through participatory action research for the prevention of trafficking in persons and the reintegration of trafficking victims and those subjected to exploitation. This work is made possible with the support of **Terre des Homes (TDH)**, a leading Swiss organization for children's aid. The project intervention covered five panchayats (Aarya, Hisri, Bethat, Kharki, and Parehpat) in the Kisko Block of Lohardaga District.



The project involved adolescents, community influencers, male members, community members, and social workers, addressing topics such as gender and sexuality, mental health, psychosocial support (MHPSS), safeguarding, and Kabaddi for protection. LGSS aimed to support victims of trafficking and exploitation in returning to safe, protective, and resilient communities, while also empowering girls at risk of unsafe migration. These efforts utilized innovative and sustainable approaches, recognizing that poverty often compels families to migrate to areas with inadequate living conditions, leading to an increased risk of violence and discrimination against girls and young women in the context of patriarchal social values. During the 2022-2023 period, more than 1,200 adolescents attended MHPSS and gender and sexuality sessions within village-level Child and Youth Participation (CYPs) groups and in schools. Additionally, 900 community members participated in awareness sessions on gender-related topics, and 456 male members and 245 community influencers attended sessions focusing on gender-based discussions.

Significant changes have been observed in the behaviour of adolescent girls and boys. They are now well-informed about gender and sexuality differences and have acquired knowledge of various safety tools.

Literacy program

The India Literacy Project (ILP), funded by ILP-USA, began working with LGSS in 2010. After the successful implementation of the project in Kairo block, it was expanded to the Kisko block of Lohardaga district. The project covered a total of 40 villages, 34 schools, and 72 Anganwadi Centers (AWCs).

The project aimed to empower the community to ensure quality education in preschool and primary levels, along with the empowerment of adolescents to become responsible citizens.

The thematic overview of the project included: • Ensuring 100% preschool education for children aged 3-5 years in the Anganwadi Centers. • Ensuring quality education for children aged 6 to 14 in schools with 100% admission, attendance, and retention, both in schools and Village Learning Centers. • Career guidance and life skills.

Major achievements of the project during the year:

- The establishment of Village Learning Centres (VLCs) in 42 locations across 40 intervention villages, supported by 42 Vidya Saathi. A total of 911 community children (437 boys and 474 girls) were studying in these 42 VLCs.
- Organizing career guidance sessions in 10 high schools in Lohardaga District, with 674 students participated.
- Conducting life skills training in 6 Panchayats of Kisko block, with 167 adolescents participated.



- Providing Gram Panchayat-level training to Anganwadi Level Monitoring and Support Committee (ALMSC) members on their roles and responsibilities, food safety, and child rights. A total of 202 ALMSC members attended these training sessions.
- Celebrating Children's Day in 40 villages, including activities such as painting, games, and speech competitions.
- Assisting in COVID vaccination awareness and organizing vaccination booths in collaboration with the Lohardaga district COVID vaccination team.
- Distributing play materials (alphabet, counting, animals, flowers, body parts, and other handmade Teaching-Learning Materials) in 72 AWCs in Kisko Block.
- Providing training to 72 AWCs on preschool teaching methodology using Teaching-Learning Materials. A total of 136 Anganwadi Workers (AWWs) attended the training.
- Organizing Gram Panchayat-level meetings to discuss roles and responsibilities, with 201 School Management Committee (SMC) members participating in the training.
- Conducting Bal-Sansad (Child Parliament) trainings in 43 schools in Kisko block, with 846 Bal-Sansad members attending the training sessions.
- Distributing teaching and learning materials for Village Learning Centre volunteers in Kisko, including blackboards, storybooks, English modules, and English practice books for students. The program had Mr. Arvind Kumar Lal (SDM, Lohardaga) as the chief guest.

ASER

Annual Status of Education Report (ASER) is a nationwide household survey that captures the status of Children enrollment and learning outcomes in rural India every Year. LGSS contributed with 30 volunteers in data collection and community engagement in 30 villages of Kuru Block in Lohardaga District, reaching rural communities to assess the educational landscape. The survey helped us understand and improve education in Lohardaga, providing curial information for enhancing the educational environment in the schools.

Health Awareness Program

COVID affected the people worldwide and Covid Vaccination was one of the preventive measures to protect against Covid. Many people were out of reach of vaccination due to lack of awareness and community had myths and misconception about vaccination. LGSS is very sensitive to Health issues, creating awareness program to motivate people to take nutritious food, supported by Unicef.

This project was implemented in tribals villages, including urban areas of six blocks of Simdega, Gumla & Lohardaga, Jharkhand. Under the project the team did work hard and created awareness among the community regarding the Covid vaccination, health and



nutrition, WASH and child protection behaviours and services. The program included capacity building of team members, rapport building in community by meeting with SHGs, ANMs, AWWs and Swasthya Sahiya during VHSNDs, Nuked nattak, using banners and posters in the festivals like Durga puja and Chatt for community awareness, and organizing the international Nutrition months and Hand washing day etc.

Major achievements of the project:

- In terms of Covid vaccination, we organized 139 special vaccination camps in remote, hard-to-reach tribal areas, where 6404 people aged 18 and above were counselled and facilitated for the 2nd dose.
- We identified and counselled 546 individuals in left-out and resistance pockets for Covid vaccination, with 5665 people aged 18 and above counselled and facilitated for the booster dose.
- 1206 left-out and drop-out children were enrolled in various government schools in the project area.
- As a precautionary measure in Covid-19 situations, 97465 hand washing demonstrations in schools and 158200 in families were conducted. This was made possible through the efforts of the project staff to reach remote villages.
- We reached out to 1656 PRI members, 45 Municipal Ward members, and 1350 Pahan Pujari/Faith leaders who were oriented on Covid vaccination and other key health, nutrition, and WASH education behaviours. They were subsequently engaged in their catchment area for the same.
- LGSS constructed 25 Hand wash units in intervention area.

Livelihood Promotion program: Promotion of Organic farming

Livelihood Promotion program was implemented among the poor and marginalized people of The Kairo block in Lohardaga district with the support of Azim Premji Philanthropic Initiatives in 26 villages across 5 panchayats starting from May 2021. The project covered 7,190 households in the target area, with a total population of 37,867. Among the population, 62.28% were from the Scheduled Tribe communities, mainly Munda and Oraons, and 64% of the total population were engaged in daily wage labour, while 17% were involved in agricultural labour. Approximately 80% of the population fell into the small and marginal category, resulting in around 4,500 households as direct beneficiaries, impacting a working population of 30,000 individuals.

The project mainly focused on employment generation, capacity development, women's empowerment, crop production, household food security, livelihood improvement, natural resource management, MGNREGA convergence, and increasing household income. These objectives were achieved through various means, including regular meetings, organized



training sessions, workshops, exposure visits, and field demonstrations of high-value crops, technological agricultural input support, resource management, collective planning, monitoring, review, documentation, and reporting.

Major achievements of the project:

- 812 households benefited from a seed bank.
- 650 farmers benefited from polished seeds and small equipment support in all 26 villages in the intervention area.
- A total of 650 households had access to these equipments, and 820 households received seed support.
- 600 households used solar pumps for irrigation at no cost.
- 630 households saw their income increase by up to 20% through livestock.
- 1055 households experienced a 30% increase in income with the help of project schemes.
- 1051 farmers were trained in the System of Rice Intensification (SRI) method of paddy cultivation.
- 1200 farmers received training on vegetable cultivation.
- 315 farmers were trained in the System of Wheat Intensification (SWI) method of wheat cultivation.
- 1200 farmers were engaged in vegetable cultivation using organic manure
- 393 practiced the SWI method of wheat cultivation using organic manure.
- 694 farmers developed nurturing gardens to meet their vegetable needs.
- 139 compost pits were established in the intervention area.
- 2712 farmers manufactured organic manure for personal and business use.
- 144 vermin compost units were established in the intervention area.
- 585 households benefited from solar pumps.
- A total of 300 assets were created with MGNREGA support.
- 630 households experienced a 20% increase in income through livestock.
- 1055 households had their income rise by 30% with the help of project schemes.
- 1570 households benefited from private services.

“Goonj” Dignity for Work

The Dignity for Work (DFW) program was initiated in partnership with Goonj since 2016. The objective of this program was to develop and maintain village-based infrastructure and assets. As part of their remuneration, workers were provided with a kit of clothes, shoes, blankets, and other essentials.

In the year 2022-23, the following activities were undertaken under the program:

- 1475 kits of essential goods were provided to 1,435 poor families under the DFW program.
- 75 nutrition gardens, 8 small ponds, 2 large ponds, 6 drain cleanings, and approximately 5 kilometres of kachha road were repaired.
- 650 small farmers were given vegetable seeds and organic manure under the livelihood promotion program.

Skills Development under LEDP

Livelihood Enterprises & Development Program (LEDP) a NABARD sponsorship supported 90 tribal women of Saktar and Amgaon villages of Albert Ekka Jari block of Gumla district in Jharkhand for sustainable livelihood. First women were provided the residential training on Rope making by the Solar Power Machine and installed two units of solar power machine which saved the time of women and earning increased. Earlier they used the manual in which they invest more time. 90 women are regularly using the solar Power Rope making Machine and increased their rope production which has good demand in local market. It's become good source of livelihood for these women. 81 Women from 15 Women's WSHG has credit linkage with a bank.


